# Orlando artist has exhibition at city library

Paintings by Martha Sanders are being showcased at the Orlando Public Library.

The "Brushworks" exhibition consists of nearly 30 portraits and abstracts created in watercolors and acrylics.

Sanders of Orlando attended the San Francisco Art Institute. She has been exhibiting in solo and gallery shows since 1982, and her work is in private and public collections.

The award-winning artist says her artwork "hovers between abstraction and a personal hieroglyphics."

The Orlando Public Library exhibit, which runs through the end of December, is the largest solo show ever for Sanders. In January, her artwork will be exhibited at the Washington Park library branch in Orlando.
